

CMS Emergency Prep Requirements

- ▶ In 2016, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid issued final Conditions of Participation (CoP) for 17 types of Medicaid and Medicare providers @ emergency management- FQHCs, RHCs, CMHA, IHS, hospice, LTCs, etc. by November 16, 2017
- Requirements will include:
 - ▶ Conduct Risk Assessment and Planning
 - ▶ Develop Policies and Procedures
 - ► Create Communication Plan
 - ▶ Training and Plan Testing

- CMS makes assumptions that all FQHCs are training staff on emergency plans based upon the <u>HRSA 2007-015 PIN</u>
 - ► Health centers should provide ongoing training on emergency management and the implementation of the EMP to employees at all levels of the organization. The FQHC/RHC must train their staff on the emergency policies and procedures annually
- ► CMS Section 491.12(d) will require RHCs/ FQHCs to develop and maintain emergency preparedness training and testing programs and review and update these programs at least annually

Benefits of Training, Disaster Drills and Exercises to your FQHC

- Meet CMS Compliance
- ► Test all or part of your existing plans
- Staff gets to practice your emergency policies and procedures w/o the stress of an actual disaster
- ► Highlights deficiencies in your plans that you can correct by implementing your improvement plan
- Planning for the drill or exercise will be another opportunity to review your existing plan

Training and Exercise Benefits to Your Community

- Meet CMS Compliance
- Determine your response coordination and logistics with your healthcare partners pre-event
- Clarifies the response roles all the partners will play
- Maintain/strengthen relationships with disaster planning partners- hospitals, PH, public safety agencies, CBOs
- Learn local and state emergency management protocol and proceduresi.e., resource requesting




CMS Requirement: Whom You Need to Train

- Section 491.12(d)(1) will require each RHC and FQHC to annually:
 - Provide initial training in emergency preparedness policies and procedures to all new and existing staff
 - Individuals providing services under arrangement (contractors)
 - ► Volunteers, consistent with their expected EM roles
 - Maintain documentation of that training. Each RHC and FOHC will also have to ensure that its staff could demonstrate knowledge of those emergency procedures.



Drills and Exercise Types



Training Topics and Documentation

- ▶ What do we train our staff, contractors and volunteers?
 - Incident Command System
 - Evacuation procedures and shelter in place procedures
 - Incident Action Planning
 - Business continuity plan
 - Disaster Drills and Exercises
- When do we train our staff, contractors and volunteers?
 - New staff orientation
 - Annually
- How do we document our training?
 - Sign in sheets, training certificates
 - Waiting on the CMS Interpretative Guidance for documentation requirements
 - After Action Report

Developing a Training/Exercise Plan

Training/Drill	Timeline	Task
Drill	Monthly	Communication systems- radios
Drill	Quarterly	Staff notification
Functional/Tabletop Exercise	Annually- alternate every 6 months with FE	Emergency or business continuity plan
All Staff Training	Annually	Emergency procedures
Full Scale Exercise	Annually	Facility, Community, regional, state exercise
