

## Celebrating 30 Years of Service to Community Health Centers 1977 - 2007

1977	San Diego Council of Community Clinics (SDCCC) established by community clinics in San Diego County
1978	Developed first agency goals and objectives "to improve quantity and quality of health care to the poor"
1979	Medical & Lab Supply Co-op formed (group purchasing organization)
1980	Participated in meetings of the California Clinic Network (precursor to California Primary Care Association)
1981	Obtained Wholesale Pharmacy Permit which allowed drug orders to be delivered directly to the SDCCC
1982	Executed contract with Scripps to provide services to clinic-referred patients
1983	Expanded Co-op membership to organizations located in Imperial and Orange Counties
1984	Developed 5-year Strategic Plan with goals including cooperative purchasing, advocacy, technical assistance, shared services, data collection and analysis, and information and referral
1984	Received funding for Hypertension Control Agency (HCA 7) for San Diego and Imperial Counties
1987	Established HIV prevention program
1988	SDCCC employed 22 staff and operated 9 programs
1989	Implementation of Tobacco Tax funding (AB 75)
1990	County of San Diego Board of Supervisors established the HIV Planning Council in conjunction with the SDCCC
1991	Kaiser Permanente-Community Clinic Partnership began
1991	County of San Diego began long-term contract with SDCCC to administer the Ryan White Specialty Pool
1993	Community Clinics Health Network established to support clinics in managed care
1994	Changed organization name from San Diego Council of Community Clinics to Council of Community Clinics (CCC)
1995	Joined as a member of the California Primary Care Association, which was created in 1994
1996	Completed Medi-Cal health plan contracts for Sharp, CHG, Foundation, Great American, and CompCare
1997	Obtained first out-of-state contract for group purchasing when Planned Parenthood Southwest Oregon joined
1998	Created Physician Council with clinic medical directors and began to meet on a monthly basis
1999	Began contract with the County of San Diego for telephone triage services
2000	Developed Quality Management Plan to standardize QM activities across clinics
2001	Advocacy activities of clinic consortia statewide coordinated through funding from The California Endowment
2002	Technical Services Organization established to provide IT services to clinics
2002	Established community clinic emergency preparedness program
2003	Received federal funding from HRSA for 3-year HCAP diabetes care coordination program
2004	Implemented disease registries in 12 clinics
2005	Received funding from the First 5 Commission of San Diego for a multi-year countywide oral healthcare initiative
2006	Council Connections established as a Premier Contracted Affiliate
2006	Awarded a multi-year contract for Mental Health Services Act (Prop 63) from the County of San Diego
2007	Received federal funding from HRSA for a 3-year project for countywide health information exchange
2007	Council Connections eliminated member service fees

## Community Health Center Milestones

1968	State Health Department provided seed money to Indian reservations to form the California Rural Indian Health Demonstration Project (became Indian Health Council in 1970)
1969	Escondido Community Clinic opened, with \$50,000 from the city, a \$90,000 loan, and \$60,000 in donations (now part of Neighborhood Healthcare)
1969	Centro de Salud de la Communidad de San Ysidro established by a local women's organization as a voluntary program through a partnership with the medical society and UCSD (now San Ysidro Health Center)
1970	Chicano Free Clinic created by community activists to bring medical services to the Barrio (became Family Health Centers of San Diego in 1973)
1971	Public health workers and volunteers established the first health programs for uninsured residents in North County (became North County Health Project in 1973)
1972	Linda Vista Health Care Center established in basement of current clinic site by community volunteers (now part of San Diego Family Care)
1972	Vista Community Clinic opened in donated space at the local dog pound; all staff were volunteers working for free
1973	Operation Samahan opened in a small barbershop downtown to provide health service to Filipino patients
1974	East County Health Services established (now part of Neighborhood Healthcare)
1975	Mountain Empire Family Medicine opened (now part of Mountain Health & Community Services)
1976	Indian Health Council became the first facility dedicated to providing health services to Native Americans in San Diego
1977	Sycuan Medical/Dental Center established, consisting of 2 dental treatment room and 3 medical exam rooms
1978	Clinicas de Salud del Pueblo opened Calexico site
1979	Operation Samahan opened National City site with one exam room and one provider
1981	Federal Health Manpower Shortage Areas (HMSAs) designated around Linda Vista, Beach Area, and Mid-City clinics
1982	Planned Parenthood of San Diego and Riverside Counties joined the CCC
1983	Southern Indian Health Council moved onto the Barona reservation
1986	La Maestra Amnesty Center established to serve persons seeking residency status
1987	Southern Indian Health Council acquired land in Alpine which was placed into federal trust
1988	NMA Comprehensive Health Center opened its Euclid site and joined the CCC
1990	Vista Community Clinic established the Health Promotion Center
1991	Linda Vista Health Care Center became the first FQHC-LA in California (now part of San Diego Family Care)
1992	Clinicas de Salud opened new Calexico Medical and Dental Clinics
1993	Sycuan Medical Dental Center opened on-site pharmacy
1994	Mountain Health & Community Services opened High Desert Family Medicine site
1994	Family Health Centers established Ciaccio Memorial Clinic, the largest freestanding HIV clinic in San Diego County
1995	Vista Community Clinic opened VCC-West as a collaboration with Tri-City Medical Center
1996	La Maestra Family Clinic established general primary care satellite clinic in downtown San Diego
1997	Vista Community Clinic opened 30,000 square foot primary care clinic and corporate HQ on Vale Terrace
1998	La Maestra Family Clinic formed Economic Development unit to provide training and job placement
1999	Clinicas de Salud opened new Brawley Clinic
2000	San Ysidro Health Center initiated the Southern California Border HIV/AIDS Project with UCSD
2001	Imperial Beach Health Center awarded funding from the State to build a new facility
2002	North County Health Services accepted into the BPHC Health Disparities Collaborative for asthma
2003	Indian Health Council began efforts for Native American Research Center for Health (CA-NARCH)
2004	Operation Samahan began the development of an integrated PM/EMR based on Open Source technology
2005	Neighborhood Healthcare took over behavioral health department from Interfaith Community Services
2006	Planned Parenthood established their own medical lab to process over 160,000 tests per year

Neighborhood Healthcare opened Pediatric Prenatal Health Center with funding from First 5 Commission of San Diego

2007
