


From 2015-2018, San Diego County's aggregated HEDIS measures were as good or better than all plans statewide.


San Diego County vs. State

In 2020, among the 10 consistently reported payer quality metrics, 3 of Integrated Health Partners' HEDIS measures were **above the 75th percentile**, and 6 were **above the 50th**, for its largest payer with over 115K lives.
