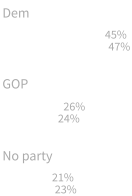

## ASSEMBLY DISTRICT 60 DEMOGRAPHICS



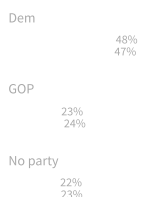

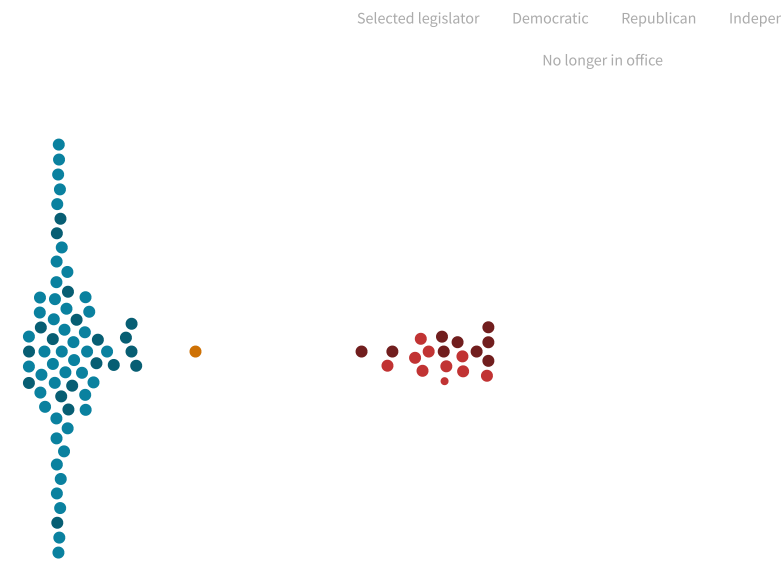

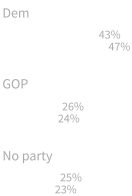

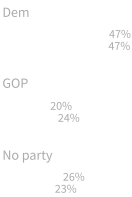
ASSEMBLY DISTRICT 80 DEMOGRAPHICS
