OUTREACH & ENGAGEMENT: REQUIREMENTS

- Managed Care Plans (MCP) are responsible for engaging Health Homes Program (HHP) eligible members, using state-determined, Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services-approved criteria
- MCPs will link HHP members to one of the contracted Community-Based Care Management Entities (CB-CME)
- If the HHP member's assigned PCP is a CB-CME, the member will be assigned to that CB-CME (unless the member chooses another CB-CME)

OUTREACH & ENGAGEMENT: REQUIREMENTS

- All HHP engagement and services can be provided to members and their family/support persons through

– E-mails	– Letters
– Texts	– Mailings
– Social media	– Community outreach
– Phone calls	– In-person meetings

- Communication and information must meet health literacy standards and trauma-informed care standards and be culturally appropriate
- MCPs must show active, meaningful and progressive attempts at member engagement each month until the member is engaged

OUTREACH & ENGAGEMENT: CHALLENGES

- **Locating eligible members**
 - Incorrect contact information
 - Unstable housing/Homelessness
 - Unresponsive to outreach
- **Engaging members**
 - Unknown/new program
 - Low health literacy
 - Distrust in entities
 - Cultural differences
 - Linguistic barriers



OUTREACH & ENGAGEMENT: CHALLENGES



Keeping members engaged

- Difficulty maintaining contact over time
- Loss of interest in the program
- Non-linear paths to recovery
- Prior negative experiences with health care or case management services

HARBAGE CONSULTING'S ROLE

- Outreach is offered at no cost on behalf of DHCS for educational purposes
- The goal is to educate service providers and others who interact with the HHP-eligible population. Topics include

 - Eligibility criteria and how members join the HHP
 - Service delivery under the HHP
 - Expectation setting
