




OUR FIRST REGIONAL DENTAL FACILITY THE LADYSMITH DENTAL CENTER � OPENED JULY 2003










Zip codes with 10 or more patients treated at FQHC Dental Sites by Year

Our Impact on Dental ER Visits

Do Routine Dental Care Services at Community Health Centers Reduce Nontraumatic Dental Emergency Department Visits in Rural Wisconsin?

This study compared utilization of nontraumatic dental ED visits between 2009 and 2012 in each of the communities where dental care services have been available through FHC community health centers. Multipayer claims data from the WHIO data marts were used to count the number of ED visits for nontraumatic dental care in those communities.

Results

Overall utilization of nontraumatic dental ED visits decreased between 2009 and 2012 in the nine rural Wisconsin communities where family health centers have been offering dental care services.



Our Impact on Access to Dental Care for the Disabled

Marshfield Family Health Center (FHC) Dental Program

For State Fiscal Year 2014, FHC provided dental services to 1,771 BadgerCare recipients that were classified as disabled and living in one of the 27 counties. This is 1 of every 3 (33.3%) of all disabled BadgerCare members that had a dental service in those counties. Over the same time period, 167 BadgerCare adults age 18 and older were treated in a hospital setting by FHC dentists. This is 41 percent of all BadgerCare adults treated by a dentist in a hospital setting statewide.


