SAMAHAN

Samahan is a Filipino word for "working together"

- Formed in 1972 by a group of doctors and nurses in a downtown San Diego barber shop
- Emphasis on culturally and linguistically competent health services for Filipinos, Asian Pacific Islanders, Latinos, and welcomes all communities
- Clinic sites in National City, City Heights, Mira Mesa, Rancho Penasquitos, and Lincoln Acres
- Serving 20,000 people annually
- Provides primary care: women's health, adult health, adolescent services, geriatric care
- Provides dental care, behavioral health, family planning, integrative health & wellness services, social services and health education, cancer patient services
- Youth2Youth Teen Center provides after school programs, peer counseling, referrals
- Community engagement: voter registration, policy advocacy (e.g. Medi-Cal coverage of translation services), coalition building, working along small businesses and restaurants to advocate for healthier living
- Only entity in San Diego awarded several national grants and accolades for work within Asian Pacific Islander American communities
