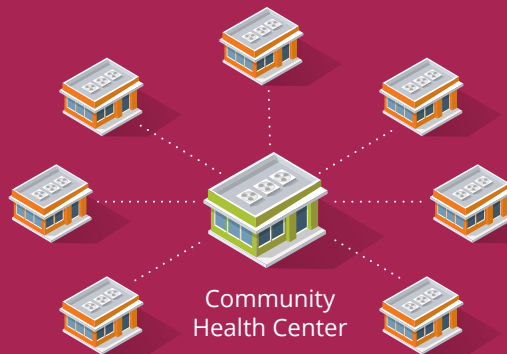

Screened Over **65,000*** Individuals for Alcohol and Other Drugs Since November 2018

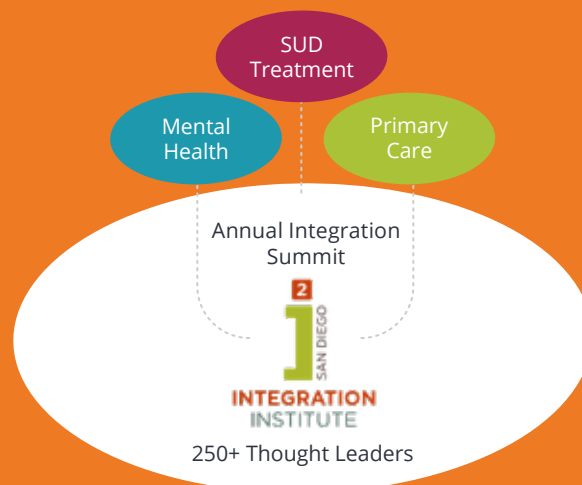
