

Behavioral Health Services at HCP Member Health Centers

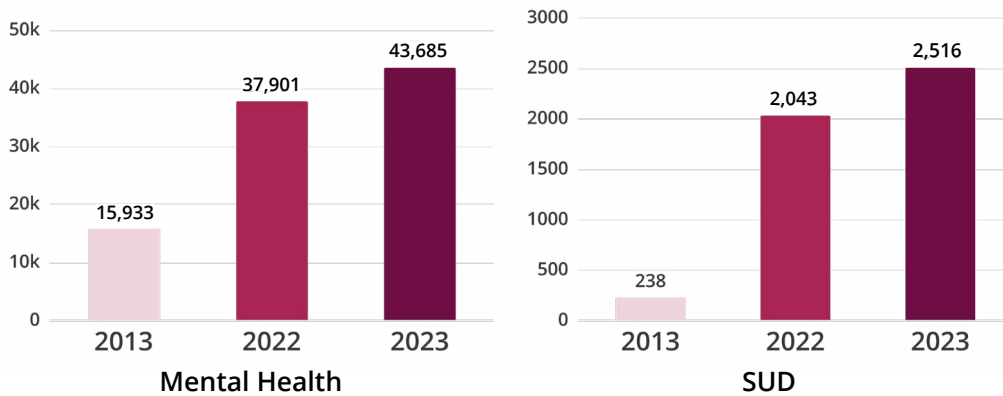

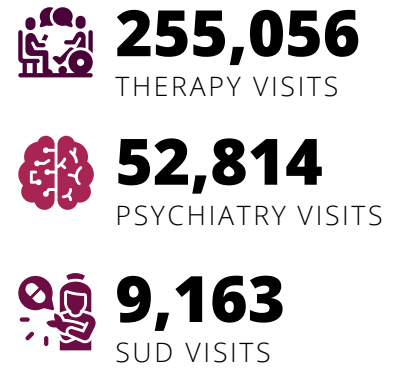
BEHAVIORAL HEALTH (BH) SERVICE UTILIZATION

NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS RECEIVING BH CARE



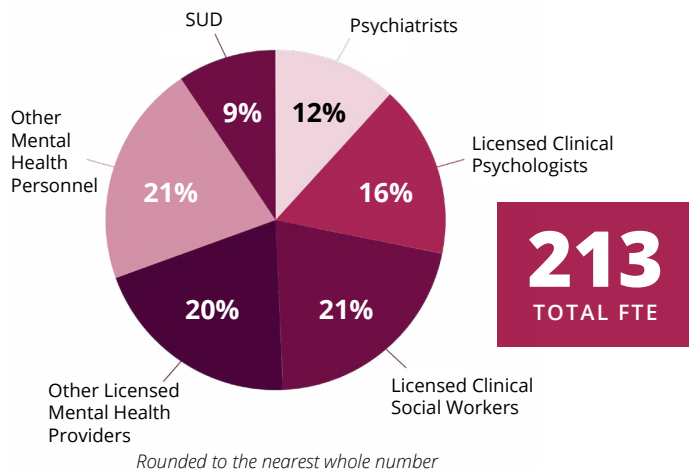
BH VISITS IN 2023
